Black Creek/Reedy Creek Greenway



BLACK CREEK/UMSTEAD/REEDY CREEK GREENWAY

This 14-mile stretch of trail is the Triangle's longest multiuse trail yet. It's now possible to hop on your bike - or lace up your sneakers - and take the greenway from Cary's Godbold Park on N.W. Maynard Road, along Black Creek to Lake Crabtree, through Umstead State Park, past Schenck Forest, through the N.C. Museum of Art and on to Meredith College and Hillsborough Street in Raleigh. Use this handy guide to make the trip.

Hills


Most greenways follow streambeds and are flat. This greenway, however, has several hills that will test your legs.

Scenic highlights

- Lake Crabtree** - Trail climbs above the lake; a great spot to rest and look for kayakers on the water.
- Umstead State Park** - You can't help but marvel that a forest like this exists in a metropolitan area.
- Reedy Creek Greenway between Umstead and Edwards Mill Road** - Likewise, you can't help but marvel over the fact this much pastoral land remains in a metro area.
- N.C. Museum of Art** - A unique stretch peppered with such tasty art as a big corn dog (Martha Jackson-Jarvis' "Crossroads") and those plant onion rings (Thomas Bayre's "Wye").

How far is it?


- Godbold Park to Umstead Park entrance: 0.2 miles
- Through Umstead Park to Reedy Creek Road: 4.7 miles
- Reedy Creek Road to N.C. Museum of Art: 2.8 miles
- Museum of Art to I-440 bridge: 0.8 mile
- I-440 bridge to end of trail: 1.4 miles









Crabtree Creek Greenway
